After You're Fit

Noises And Expansion: Laminate takes a day or two to fully settle once fit, you might notice noises and creaking during the first few days. This is just down to the laminate expanding and contracting as it climatises to the temperatures in your home. This is normal, and the expansion gaps around the edges of the room are there to allow this.

Routine Maintenance and Cleaning

Dusting and Sweeping

Dust and debris can scratch laminate flooring over time. Regular dusting and sweeping are essential.

- **Frequency:** Sweep or dust daily or as needed, especially in high-traffic areas.
- **Tools:** Use a soft-bristle broom, a dry microfiber mop, or a vacuum with a hard floor setting to avoid scratching.

Regular Cleaning

Laminate is moisture-sensitive, so avoid excessive water and use gentle cleaning methods.

- **Damp Mopping:** Use a slightly damp microfiber mop—never a wet mop. Excess water can seep into seams, causing swelling.
- **Laminate-Safe Cleaner:** Choose a cleaner specifically designed for laminate or make a DIY cleaner with a few drops of mild dish soap in water. Avoid harsh chemicals or abrasives.

Quick Spot Cleaning

- **Immediate Clean-Up:** Clean up spills as soon as they happen to prevent water from soaking into seams.

- **Spot Cleaning:** For sticky spills or dirt, use a lightly damp cloth and a laminate-safe cleaner.

Deep Cleaning

Frequency and Methods

Deep cleaning helps maintain the floor's appearance and prolong its lifespan.

- **Frequency:** Deep clean every 3-6 months or as needed.
- **Steam Cleaners:** Avoid steam cleaners on laminate, as they can warp or damage the floor.
